Brambridge wastewater flood protection scheme (2)

Introduction

Southern Water's contractor 4Delivery is installing a new sewer in both Church Lane and Spring Lane to increase the capacity of the sewerage network. This will help reduce the possibility of flooding.

The Works

Work in **Church Lane** is progressing very well and is three weeks ahead of schedule. 4Delivery will complete its works mid November and hand Church Lane back to Hampshire County Council for resurfacing.



Reinstatement in Church Lane

4Delivery will start work in **Spring Lane** (Highbridge Road to the junction of Upper and Lower Moors Road) at the end of November. About 220 metres of new sewer is to be installed and it is anticipated that this section of Spring Lane will be re-opened by Christmas 2008.

To minimise any disruption to the local community, this section of Spring Lane will have a rolling road closure programme. The lane will be closed in approximately 50 metre sections ensuring access to Spring Lane is maintained as much as possible. 4Delivery continues to liaise with the local traders, Colden Common Parish Council and Hampshire County Council.
